The Centre de Karaté Perez IKO Inc. is proud to organize this tournament for all categories of students wishing to participate in kata events, elite kata, and fights (juniors, teenagers, adults, and this year, seniors). This competition is open to children aged 5 and up, women, and men of all ages.

Please review the document as modifications have been made to the semi-contact fighting rules. ***No chest protector this year for any categoryDisqualification without refund if the weight at the competition varies too much from that recorded at registration (5 pounds or more)***

We will start in the morning with all the events for children aged 5 to 14, beginning with the kata section followed by the semi-contact fights. In the afternoon, we will proceed with the events for the 15 and older categories, beginning with kata, elite kata, followed by semi-knockdown fights with equipment. There will also be a "Full Contact" section FOR AGES 18 AND UP.

This competition will be held in memory of **Shihan Jacques Sandulescu**. All information and registration documents can be found on the website: www.budogiant.com

Registrations must be completed and received before October 6, 2024, to allow us to compose and finalize the categories.

General information

Deadline for submitting registrations:

October 6, 2024. Any registration submitted after this date will be rejected. <u>No on-site registration will be accepted</u>.

Each dojo director must register their dojo by clicking the registration link on the website <u>www.budogiant.com</u> so that their students can subsequently register online. At the end of each registration, the registered student and the director of their dojo will receive a registration confirmation with all the details. It is each person's responsibility to verify that all the data is correct and to contact the organizers in case of an error.

*** Please note that a participant's weight may be subject to verification by competition officials, and a significant difference between the recorded weight and the verified weight (5 pounds or more) may result in the participant's disqualification without refund. ***

*Payment of registration fees:

*On October 19, the director of each dojo must go to the "dojo director's table" to pay the registration fees for all their students <u>in cash</u>. Volunteers will not ask each student to pay their individual registration fees at the time of their registration.

Only one cash payment per dojo is requested.

• The registration fee is \$65 per participant for 1 or 2 events

The price for Full Contact is \$65; if the Full Contact participant also participates in elite kata, the price will be \$80.

- Participants must be able to confirm their age with a valid photo ID at the time of registration. Example: health insurance card/passport.
- A parent or legal guardian must sign the individual registration form for any participant aged 17 or under.

Categories and subcategories

Registered participants will be grouped into pre-established categories based on the type of event, age, belt level, gender, and weight. Please refer to the category tables.

A minimum of 2 participants per category is required. If only one candidate is registered for a given category, they will be reclassified or refunded. If there are too many participants registered in the same category, it will be subdivided into two or more subcategories (the management reserves the right to merge categories).

Guidelines for "full contact/one match" participants:

- Weigh-in is mandatory for all "full contact/one match" fighters. They must arrive on the day of the competition by 12:00 PM (before lunch) to complete the registration.
- For fairness and safety, ensure that the weight of each registered participant in combat is as accurate as possible. Note that a significant difference (3 kg) between a participant's weight on the day of the tournament and the weight indicated on their registration form will automatically result in a genten ichi (penalty point) for the participant at fault.

Guidelines for "semi-contact" and "semi-knockdown" participants:

- Participants in "semi-contact" combat must be weighed by the management of their dojo to ensure that each participant is placed in the correct weight category.
- Participants registered for the "semi-contact" or "semi-knockdown" competition must be equipped with protective gear that complies with current regulations (helmet, shin and foot protectors, gloves). The mouthguard and athletic supporter are optional but strongly recommended.

No chest protector for all categories

***Disqualification without refund if the weight at the competition varies too much from that recorded at registration (5 pounds or more) ***

Spectator admission prices:

13 years and older: 10\$6-12 years: 5\$5 years and under : Free

Coaches

We are pleased to offer free admission to the Director (or person in charge) of each participating dojo as well as their coaches. The established ratio is one coach for approximately **5 registered participants (maximum of 3 coaches per dojo)**. All additional coaches will have to pay the spectator admission fee to access the gymnasium.

Coaches will receive a pass allowing them to access the competition area. The number of coaches inside the competition area will be limited to avoid hindering the work of referees and volunteers. This measure also ensures a better view for spectators.

Dojo Director

- Upon arrival, the dojo director must present themselves at the "dojo directors' table."
- The dojo director will receive their pass, the list of events for their students, and any other relevant documents, if applicable.
- The dojo director must report any absences of their students, if applicable.
- The dojo director will receive the passes for their coaches. All coaches must wear them to access the competition area.
- The dojo director must settle the registration fees for their students.
- The head referee will meet with all directors and coaches before the start of the fights.
- The awarding of trophies for each category will take place as soon as the event is completed.

Coaches

The coaches designated by their dojo director will be responsible for their dojo's students during the competition. Their main tasks will be as follows:

- Ensure that their students promptly report to the designated field table as announced.
- Ensure that their students participating in the competition wear the appropriate gear and remain near the field throughout the event.
- Ensure that their students behave courteously and demonstrate good sportsmanship.
- Ensure that the parents and friends of their students stay away from the competition area.
- **Only one coach per fighter** is allowed near the combat area, otherwise, the fighter risks disqualification.

Kata evaluation system

- 1. The BUDO GIANT CHALLENGE 2024 is open to all styles of traditional karate.
- 2. Participants must wear the full dogi (no T-shirt).
- 3. The kata categories are defined based on the age and belt level (kyu) of the participants.

4. A judging panel consists of 3 or 5 judges, including the head judge who oversees the competition.

5. Each participant presents themselves to the judges and announces the kata they will perform. It is required to identify the chosen kata in advance.

6. All participants must perform a traditional kata. A traditional kata is a sequence of traditional karate techniques that can be taught and performed by all members of an organization; it is required during belt tests and is not a kata customized for one or a few members of the organization.

7. Each participant receives a score—between 5 and 10—from each judge; the total of the 5 assigned scores is used to determine the participant's ranking within their category.

8. If a participant chooses to perform a "non-traditional" kata, they will be disqualified, and each judge will give them the minimum score of 5.

9. As traditional katas vary from one style to another, each participant is judged based on the following criteria:

- Basic stances
- Kicking techniques
- Punching and shuto techniques
- Balance and fluidity
- Attitude and intensity
- Speed and control
- Difficulty level of the kata
- Kiai

10. The judges also take into account consistency in the execution of techniques. If a participant performs the same technique multiple times in their kata and it appears different each time, they will be penalized.

11. To establish a baseline for evaluation, the first 3 participants in a category perform their kata in succession without receiving their scores from the judges. Each of them then returns before the judges to receive their

respective scores. Afterward, the other participants perform their kata and receive their scores immediately after their performance.

12. Each participant's performance is evaluated in relation to that of the other participants in the same category.

13. In the case of a tie for first, second, or third place within a category, the head judge will ask the tied participants to perform their kata again to determine the winner of the tied position.

14. Participants from the fourth kyu to black belt must be prepared to perform two distinct traditional katas: a first kata and a second kata in the event of a tie for one of the top three positions. If a participant chooses to perform the same kata twice, each judge will deduct half a point.

ELITE KATAS (GREEN BELT AND ABOVE)

- 1. For brown and black belts, the kata evaluation system that will be in effect is the one commonly used in Japan. It is an elimination system similar to combat competitions.
- 2. Two participants perform their kata alternately, and the judges decide which participant advances to the next round using a flag system, either aka (red) or shiro (white). Therefore, to rank in their category, participants will need to perform different katas according to the rules.

Rules for "semi-contact" and "semi-knockdown" fights

1. KARATE CONTACT FIGHT WITH PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

A fight involving two opponents who can strike "with force" as long as they use legal techniques—as described in this document.

2. ELIGIBILITY

Fighters aged 5 and up, from 10th kyu (white belt) to black belt, grouped according to age, gender, kyu, and weight.

3. PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

Mandatory protective equipment: Shin (and foot) protectors, gloves, helmet

- Mouthguard: Strongly recommended for all fighters
- Mouthguard or helmet with grille: <u>Mandatory</u> for fighters with orthodontic appliances
- Athletic support (cup): Mandatory for male fighters
- Chest protector prohibited for fighters aged 13 and under
- Chest protector prohibited for fighters aged 14 and over
- Chest guard (worn inside the uniform): Strongly recommended for female fighters aged 14 and over





ALLOWED

PROHIBITED

- Wrist or ankle bandages: Prohibited for all fighters in the first fight
- No glasses
- No jewelry

4. ARBITRATION TEAM

• An arbitration team consists of a central referee who oversees the fight and 2 or 4 corner judges who evaluate the fighters, a timekeeper, and a scorekeeper.

5. COACHES

- Each fighter is entitled to one (1) coach who can represent them to a competition organizer in case of a dispute.
- Only the coach of each fighter can sit near the combat area.
- The coach is never allowed access to the combat area.

6. OFFICIAL FIGHT DURATION

- 1 ½ minutes for ages 14 and under
- 2 minutes for ages 15 and over
- 1 minute for the first and only extension—in case of a tie

7. LEGAL TECHNIQUES

- <u>To the legs (above the knees)</u>: Circular kicks and knee strikes
- <u>To the body</u>: Punches, elbow strikes, knee strikes, and kicks (direct and circular techniques)

<u>To the head</u>: Category 5 to 14 years:

Only VERY light and controlled strikes to the head/helmet are allowed Any attempt to knock out the opponent will result in disqualification

Category 15 to 17 years:

Only light and very controlled strikes to the head/helmet are allowed (U17) Any attempt to knock out the opponent will result in disgualification

Category 18 years and over (not full contact):

Only controlled strikes to the head/helmet are allowed Any attempt to knock out the opponent will result in disqualification

8. ILLEGAL TECHNIQUES

- Kicks to the knees and below the knees
- Open-hand strikes, punches, elbow strikes, and headbutts to the face, head, or neck
- All strikes—hand, punch, elbow, knee, foot—<u>to the genitals or back</u>
- Knee strikes and direct kicks to the face
- Ages 5 to 14: circular kicks to the head with force
- Grabbing
- Repeated pushing of the opponent

9. IPPON - WAZA-ARI

- **Ippon**: Immediate victory following a legal technique that has neutralized or knocked out the opponent for <u>3 seconds or more</u>—End of fight
- Waza-ari: Legal technique resulting in the opponent's failure (lowering of guard, vigilance, or physical stability) for <u>less than 3 seconds</u>—Resumption of the fight
- Second Waza-ari: Waza-ari resulting in an immediate victory (Awasete Ippon)—End of fight
- An Ippon or Waza-ari must be seen and signaled by a majority of judges and referee (2/3 or 3/5).
- The fight is interrupted by the central referee who makes the official announcement of the Ippon or Waza-ari.

10. CHUI AND GENTEN - OFFICIAL WARNINGS AND PENALTIES

- Official warnings and penalties are issued by a majority of judges and referees (at least 2/3 or 3/5). The fight is interrupted, and the central referee announces the official warning or penalty.
- Chui: Official warning following an infraction
- Genten Ichi: First penalty following 2 official warnings
- **Genten Ni Shikakku**: Second penalty following 2 more official warnings—Disqualification of the fighter—Immediate victory for the opponent.

11. HOW TO WIN A FIGHT

- By **Ippon**—Immediate victory
- With two Waza-ari—Immediate victory following the second Waza-ari
- By **unanimous decision** based on the count of Waza-ari and/or penalties at the end of the official time
- By favorable decision of a majority of judges and referees at the end of the official time
- With the **disqualification** of the opponent (**Shikakku**)—Immediate victory
- With the opponent's withdrawal (forfeit)—Immediate victory

Rules for "full contact/one match" fights

1. ELITE KARATE CONTACT FIGHT WITHOUT PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

A fight involving two opponents who can strike "with force" as long as they use legal techniques—as described in this document.

2. ELIGIBILITY

Experienced fighters aged 18 and over, grouped by gender and weight—and possibly age.

3. PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

- <u>Prohibited protective equipment</u>: Helmet, gloves, shin guards, chest protector
- Mouthguard: Strongly recommended for all fighters
- Athletic support (cup): <u>Mandatory</u> for male fighters
- Chest guard (not a hard shell worn inside the uniform): Strongly recommended for female fighters
- Wrist or ankle bandages: Prohibited for all fighters in the first fight
- Glasses: Prohibited
- Jewelry: Prohibited

4. ARBITRATION TEAM

An arbitration team consists of a central referee who oversees the fight, 4 corner judges who evaluate the fighters, a timekeeper, and a scorekeeper (track of the fights).

The arbitration committee receives complaints from coaches and may intervene with the central referee.

5. COACHES

Each fighter is entitled to <u>one (1) coach</u> who can represent them to the arbitration manager in case of a conflict.

Only the coach of each fighter can sit <u>near</u> the combat area. The coach is <u>never allowed</u> access to the combat area.

6. OFFICIAL FIGHT DURATION *** (If one match. 3 rounds of 2 mins) ***

- Qualification fight : 2 minutes
- Quarterfinal, semifinal, and final fight: **3 minutes**
- In case of a tie for any fight :
- 1st extension: **2 minutes**
- If a 2nd tie : Weighing of fighters
 - If the weight difference is less than 11 lbs (5 kg) for men or 7 lbs (3 kg) for women: The final extension is **2 minutes**
 - o Otherwise: The lighter fighter is declared the winner

7. LEGAL TECHNIQUES

<u>To the legs</u>: Circular kicks and knee strikes <u>To the body</u>: Punches, elbow strikes, knee strikes, and kicks (direct and circular techniques) <u>To the head</u>: Knee strikes and kicks (direct and circular techniques)

8. ILLEGAL TECHNIQUES

• Kicks to the knees and below the knees

- Open-hand strikes, punches, elbow strikes, and headbutts to the face, head, or neck
- All strikes—hand, punch, elbow, knee, foot—<u>to the genitals or back</u>
- Grabbing
- Repeated pushing of the opponent
- Refusing to fight

9. IPPON – WAZA-ARI

Ippon: Immediate victory following a legal technique that has neutralized or knocked out the opponent for <u>3 seconds or more</u>—End of fight

Waza-ari : Legal technique resulting in the opponent's failure (lowering of guard, vigilance, or physical stability) for <u>less than 3 seconds</u>—Resumption of the fight

Second Waza-ari: Waza-ari resulting in an immediate victory (Ippon)—End of fight

An Ippon or Waza-ari must be recognized and signaled by a majority of judges and referees (at least 3/5).

The fight is interrupted by the central referee who makes the official announcement of the Ippon or Waza-ari.

10. CHUI AND GENTEN - OFFICIAL WARNINGS AND PENALTIES

Official warnings and penalties are issued by a majority of judges and referees (at least 3/5). The fight is interrupted, and the central referee announces the official warning or penalty.

Chui: Official warning following an infraction


Genten Ichi: First penalty following 2 official warnings

Genten Ni - Shikakku: Second penalty following 2 more official warnings—Disqualification of the fighter—Immediate victory for the opponent.

11. HOW TO WIN A FIGHT

By Ippon - Immediate victory

With **two Waza-ari** – Immediate victory (Ippon) following the second Waza-ari By **unanimous decision** based on the count of Waza-ari and/or penalties at the end of the official time By **favorable decision of a majority of judges and referees** at the end of the official time With the **disqualification** of the opponent (**Shikakku**)—Immediate victory With the opponent's **withdrawal** (forfeit)—Immediate victory


